- Potential administrative/budget challenges for VT
- Increased responsibilities for State
 Coordinators and Homeless Liaisons



More support for youth and families

- ✓ Fully covers preschool students attending public schools
- ✓ School of Origin adds feeder schools
- ✓ Students have access to support after they are permanently housed(transportation)
- ✓ Unaccompanied youth have more support
- ✓ More coordination with partners
- ✓ More training for school staff
- ✓ Ensures privacy for student records FERPA



New for Homeless Students

- Transportation
 - School of origin transportation is now available for students after they are permanently housed through rest of school year
 - Addition of preschool transportation
- Preschool
 - More coordination



New Responsibilities for State Coordinators (SC) and local Homeless Liaisons (HL)

- Additional Training and TA requirements for State Coordinator (SC) and Homeless Liaisons (HL)
 - Added "professional development" and "monitoring" to SC section
 - o Brand new language in HL section
- New outreach requirements for HLs



New Responsibilities for State Coordinators (SC) and local Homeless Liaisons (HL)

- More HL supports for unaccompanied youth
 - o Reduce barriers to credit accrual & graduation
 - Provide support for post-secondary pursuits
 - Verify homeless status for FAFSA
- HLs can determine whether a child or youth is homeless according to HUD's definition of homeless.
